<b>Description</b>	
<p>Right now none of the Foreman Puppet modules have Git tags. This makes it hard to track dependencies between modules or to manage them with tools like <a href="#">librarian-puppet</a>.</p> <p>I suggest one or both of the following tag strategies:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Tag modules individually to reflect local changes, preferably with SemVer. This is Puppet Labs' recommended method and makes the most sense for module use outside the Foreman project.</li><li>2. Tag them as part of the larger release cycle using a prefix, e.g., release-1.4. This might be easier on the project's workload.</li></ol>
